## **URcast Network: A Hands on Training Session**

In West Virginia, access to digital content for every student, both in the classroom, and in the home, can be a challenge. Causes may be a lack of connectivity, or an oversaturation of the available connectivity, making the use of Internet resources a nightmare for both teachers and students alike. With URcast Network Powered by WVNET, we aim to close this digital gap by giving all students the ability to access digital content and media from the Internet, without needing to be connected. Whether it be a smartphone, tablet, or computer, teachers have the ability to control digital content oriented messages to students using the existing LAN and WiFi infrastructure inside the school, essentially creating a flipped classroom inside of the school, or having the lessons taken home and reviewed without the need for Internet access. How does this work? We will have a hands on training session as to the power of this tool in this pre-conference session.
